UCSD STUDENT POLICIES & MISCONDUCT

The Student Conduct Code and other University of California and UCSD policies govern the academic and non-academic conduct of UCSD students. These policies specify the procedures and timelines which must be adhered to when allegations of misconduct are asserted. STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

The designated principal members of student organizations are responsible for the conduct of the student organization for which they provide leadership. If a general member of a student organization engages in conduct that violates the SCC with the support of the organization's principal members, the principal members may be punished for the general member's conduct.
